Believing & Following



There is a difference between "believing Christ" and "believing in Christ". There are many who believe He was and is the Son of God but they have never put their faith in Him.

TO BELIEVE IN CHRIST MEANS THAT YOU:

- **Recognize He is who He says He is ...** the Son of God and God the Son.
- Recognize your condition. The bible says that all have sinned and all fall short of God's glory. No one is righteous, not even one! If you place your faith in Him and believe in Him, you left that tomb with Him! If you let Him take charge of your life, your victory over death is as real as His! There's much more to learn and know about Jesus but these are the essentials for believing. The place to learn and continue growing is in a church body. The church will help you understand your bible, know Jesus and walk with Him daily. You won't make it on your own. You need others.
